Catholic Schools Week 2024

This week is Catholic Schools Week, and so we offer a big "shout out" to those students from our parish attending Catholic elementary and high schools, and our parishioners who serve in the ministry of Catholic education. At Saint Paul of the Cross Parish, we are honored to provide financial support for several diocesan schools where our children are enrolled (e.g. Ave Maria, St. Louise de Marillac and Mother of Mercy Academies, as well as Seton LaSalle High School). In a particular way, we have been blessed and served well the past three years by our partnership with the South Hills Catholic Academy - providing pastoral services for them such as weekly Mass and Adoration, monthly Confessions, etc. In addition, since the school began many of its families who were unaffiliated with any parish have joined ours, and we've been able to Baptize and provide the Sacraments for many children and other family members who are new to the Faith or hadn't been practicing.

Below are some excerpts from an article entitled *The Many Benefits of a Catholic Education*. It was published by the People's Alliance for Continuing Education, and I think provides a good explanation as to why the Church, our parish, and so many generous benefactors are committed to promoting and sustaining Catholics education

Catholic Schools Provide...

• A Spiritual View Of The World:

Catholic education not only teaches general education, but also balances education with deep spiritual immersion. Catholic education is very active in teaching a child that God is in his life and all around him. A child will learn how to see these "footprints of God" in his daily life. As a child's awareness of God develops, he also becomes an instrument of God's grace in the family, community and in the world.

• An Inspired View Of The Scriptures:

A Catholic education means giving a student the opportunity to learn about the Holy Scriptures. Furthermore, the learning of the Scriptures is governed by underlying faith. Then, the students are encouraged to put into their daily lives the lessons they have learned from the good book. On top of that, a Catholic education teaches a student on how to make use of the *(continued on the next page)*

Two Special Feast Days This Week:

Friday, February 2nd, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which commemorates the 40th day after Christmas when, in accordance with Jewish Law, Mary and Joseph presented the child Jesus in the Temple. When they arrived at the Temple, they were met by a righteous and devout man named Simeon, who took Jesus into his arms and proclaimed him to be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." (See Luke 2:22-38). The Feast of the Presentation has also been traditionally referred to a Candlemas Day, because on this day the Church blesses candles which will be used to symbolize Christ, the "Light of the World".

Saturday, February 3rd, is the Feast of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr. According to tradition, while St. Blaise was imprisoned in the 4th century he kept a young boy who had a fish bone lodged in his throat from choking to death. He is therefore considered as the Patron of Throats. On Saturday, the St. Blaise Blessing of Throats will be offered during the 8:00am Mass and also at the conclusion of the 4:00 PM vigil Mass for Sunday.

Scriptures as a tool for guidance and inspiration to get them through during the toughest parts of his or her life.

Civic Responsibility And Engagement:

Catholic education not only focuses on engagement and responsibility in relation to the Church, but also to the community as a whole. According to a survey done by a non-Catholic and non-American source, the study... indicated that students from Catholic education ranked highest in terms of participating in community and civic engagement. This could mean highest in terms of charity donations, writing to legislators, volunteering, and voting. Catholic students are taught on how to gauge their words and actions against the Gospel of love and the Ten Commandments. Of course, Catholic students are given lessons that will give them strong moral and ethical foundations to help them make the right decision in situations that are not clearly black and white.

• Arts And Culture

Our civilization has moved from the Stone Age to an age rich in culture, arts and tradition. Catholic education recognizes the fact that modern society is not just all about surviving, but it's also about being cultured. This is the reason why Catholic education exposes the students to Drama, Literature, Art and Music. Furthermore, all these are governed by the philosophy that these are all Divine Praises.


