From The Pastor



How Did Jesus Pray?

During the season of Lent we are to rededicate ourselves to a deeper prayer life, in imitation of Christ who, in the Gospels, is frequently immersed in prayer to His Heavenly Father.

But just how did Jesus pray? What words did He use?

With few exceptions, the Gospels do not provide us with all that much insight into the *content* of Jesus prayer. However, because he was a faithful Jew, we can extrapolate that Jesus adopted the prayer tradition of His Jewish contemporaries. Therefore, Jesus would have paused to pray at fixed times throughout the day, specifically morning, noontime and evening. The thought here was that by praying at these set hours, the entire day would be offered to and sanctified by God.

In the early Church, Christians, many of whom were converted Jews, adopted this practice of praying at fixed hours. Overtime, the structure and content of what we today call the *Liturgy of the Hours* evolved, incorporating elements from both Jewish and Christian traditions.

The Old Testament Psalms constitute the core of the *Liturgy of the Hours* because they were originally part of the Jewish prayer book and still are a major part of Jewish worship today.

The *Liturgy of the Hours* also includes hymns, other readings from Sacred Scripture, the Church Fathers, various saints and Church documents, as well as intercessory prayers. So, while the *Liturgy of the Hours* has developed into a distinctively Christian form of prayer, it remains deeply tied to its Jewish roots through both its structure and content.

So, to pray the *Liturgy of the Hours* is, in a real sense, to pray how Jesus prayed!

Now, the *Liturgy of the Hours* is offered everyday by priests and religious throughout the world on behalf of the whole Church. For example, when I was ordained a deacon, one of the promises I made was to pray it daily for the people entrusted to my care. The *Liturgy of the Hours* is also offered everyday in a more solemn way in monasteries throughout the world.

Having said that, many lay people in recent years have been discovering the beauty of this type of prayer and have committed to praying at least parts of it everyday. Many resources, both online or in print, are accessible to everyone. One of the most popular is the *Magnificat* monthly publication, which contains sections of the *Liturgy of the Hours* as well as the daily Mass readings and other worthy Catholic devotions. Another lovely, user friendly version of Morning and Evening Prayer, is offered by *Word On Fire* (wordonfire.org.)

Solemn Vespers Today

Today at 5:00 PM please consider joining us in Saint Anne church for *Solemn Vespers*, which is sung Evening Prayer from the *Liturgy of the Hours*. Vespers will be prayed before the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar and will conclude with Benediction.



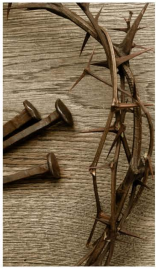

WHAT IS VESPERS?

Vespers is the liturgy of evening prayer, one of the canonical hours of the Catholic Church. The word *vesper* translates to “evening” in Latin.

Our Vespers liturgy will be prayed in the context of a Holy Hour, which will include Adoration, chanted psalms and canticles, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

WHY ATTEND VESPERS?

When we pray the Liturgy of the Hours, we are able to unite ourselves in prayer to Christ Himself. Attending and praying Vespers helps us to fulfill Jesus’ command to “pray always” (Luke 18:1). In a special way, evening prayer helps us to express gratitude for the day that has passed and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God.

The Liturgy of the Hours is like an extension of the Eucharistic celebration. Our Vespers liturgy will provide you with an additional opportunity for prayer as part of your Lenten sacrifice.

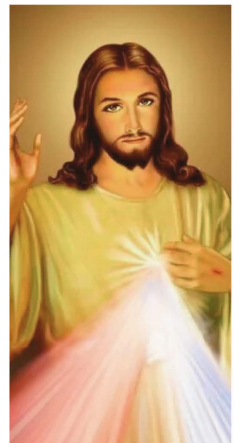

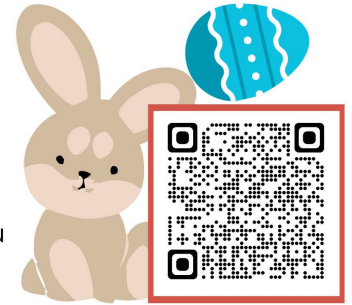

March is National Down Syndrome Month. Down Syndrome is one of several genetic conditions. It is caused by abnormal cell division resulting in extra genetic material from the 21st chromosome. This results in variations in intellectual ability, developmental delays and physical challenges. Despite this, well over 80% of those diagnosed with Down Syndrome before birth are terminated in the womb. 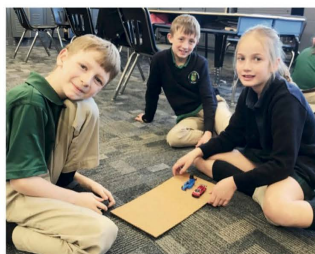
