From the Pastor

Today's Fourth Sunday of Easter is called *Good Shepherd Sunday*, because the Gospel passage on this day always makes reference to God and Jesus as a Shepherd.



And out of all the images of our Lord presented in the New Testament, the Good Shepherd has always been the favorite one for Christians, because it shows how God draws so close to us through Christ.

Seeing Christ as a Shepherd reminds us that God is not some distant, cosmic reality "way out there", but rather immerses Himself in the life of the family of man, "His flock". The Good Shepherd shares in all the complexities of human life and identifies with us, but at the same time leads "from within" and guides us in the right direction, providing us with hope and inspiration along the way.

Today is also the *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*, especially to the Priesthood, and everyone is called to pray for more shepherds to lead the Church "in the person of Jesus Christ."

Back in 1992 when I was studying to become a priest, Pope John Paul II wrote a beautiful document on the formation of Catholic priests. The document's title is *Pastores Dabo Vobis*, which is the Latin translation for words taken from a promise God makes to the prophet Jeremiah: "I will give you shepherds after my own heart" (Jer. 3:15).

The Holy Father went on to write:

In these words from the prophet Jeremiah, God promises his people that he will never leave them without shepherds to gather them together and guide them: "I will set shepherds over them who will care for them, and they shall fear no more, nor be dismayed" (Jer. 23.4).

The Church, the People of God, constantly experiences the reality of this prophetic message and continues joyfully to thank God for it. She knows that Jesus Christ himself is the living, supreme and definitive fulfillment of God's promise: "I am the good shepherd" (In. 10:11). He, "the great shepherd of the sheep" (Heb. 13:20), entrusted to the apostles and their successors the ministry of shepherding God's flock (cf. Jn. 21:15ff.; 1Pt. 5:2).

Without priests the Church would not be able to live that fundamental obedience which is at the very heart of her existence and her mission in history, an obedience in response to the command of Christ: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Mt. 28:19) and "Do this in remembrance of me" (Lk. 22:19; cf. 1 Cor. 11.24), i.e., an obedience to the command to announce the Gospel and to renew daily the sacrifice of the giving of his body and the shedding of his blood for the life of the world.

On this special day of prayer for vocations, we remember with gratitude God's promise to always provide shepherds for His Church. At the same time, we all have to do our part to pray everyday for vocations in our own families and parish, and encourage young men to consider offering their lives to God in service to His people.

A Prayer for Vocations through the intercession of St. John Vianney

O God our Father,

You promised "I will appoint shepherds for My sheep who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble: and none shall be missing." (Jer. 23:4-5).

Hear the prayers of Your flock. Through the intercession of Your beloved priest, Saint John Vianney, we beg You to call to the sacramental priesthood generous men who will desire nothing more than to serve You in imitation of Your Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, our High Priest.

And after You call them, we pray that You sustain the doubtful, console the discouraged, and strengthen the weak as they start the long and demanding preparation for the priesthood.

Mary, Mother of priests, and example of faithful, humble, and joyful acceptance of God's will, help all those who are called to the priesthood to open their ears and hearts to the gentle call of the Holy Spirit.

Sacramental Information

Routinely, requests come to the parish office that have to be denied, because those making the requests are innocently and unknowingly asking for something the Catholic Church cannot provide or does not allow. Those conflicts are described below, in a straightforward way, so as to clear up any confusion:



Baptism



Confirmation



Marriage

GODPARENTS: Several parents registering their children for Baptism have asked to have godparents who do not meet the requirements because: A) They are not fully initiated Catholics (having received Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion; or B) Because their marriage is not recognized as a valid Sacrament (i.e. blessed by the Church), and therefore the proposed godparent is ineligible to receive the Sacraments themselves, and thus cannot be held up as a role model for the child being baptized.

In order to serve as a godparent an individual must be a practicing Catholic, registered in a Catholic parish, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Communion and Confirmation, and, if married, the marriage must be recognized as a "valid Sacrament" by the Catholic Church.

These are norms provided by the Catholic Church and we are duty bound to adhere to them. To ask someone to serve as a godparent and role model of the Catholic faith who simply cannot fulfill that role is unfair to that individual and to the child who is to be baptized.

SPONSOR LETTERS: Many requests are received to provide a Sponsor letter when a parishioner has been asked to serve a Godparent for Baptism or Sponsor for Confirmation.

In order to receive a Sponsor letter the following is required:

- A) Must be registered in our parish (having attended school or CCD here decades ago does not necessarily mean one is registered).
- B) Must be Baptized, received First Eucharist and Confirmation.
- C) If Married, the Marriage must be a valid Sacramental Marriage (i.e. recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church).

MARRIAGE: Many people don't realize that a Baptized Catholic is required to be married in the Catholic Church in a Catholic ceremony with rare exception. To be married by a Justice of the Peace or on a beach or even in another non-Catholic church WITHOUT the proper dispensation renders one's marriage invalid in the eyes of the Church. This has serious ramifications as to whether one can serve as a Godparent, Confirmation Sponsor, or even receive the Sacraments themselves moving forward.

If you have any doubts as to whether or not you are in a valid Catholic Marriage or would like to pursue having your Marriage blessed by the Church, please call the parish office.

LOST CERTIFICATES: Our parish office cannot reissue misplaced certificates for sacraments received before 2019 (when the merger took place). For an official replacement, contact the Archives and Records Center of the Diocese of Pittsburgh online at *diopitt.org/archives* or call (421) 456 - 3158. The archives hold all of the Sacramental records for the former Saint Anne and Saint Winifred Parishes.
