From the Pastor



The Papacy

The past few weeks have been both moving and exciting for Catholics and really the whole world, as Pope Francis was laid to rest and Pope Leo XIV chosen as our new Holy Father.

Some reflections on what has transpired:

First, for almost a month now the entire world has been focused on the Catholic Church and the papacy with amazing intensity. This seems interesting, given the cynical posture that secular society and so many people have adopted towards the Church. And so we are led to ask: "Why all this interest in the Catholic Pope? Is it because he's simply some superstar celebrity like any other?"

No - Not at all! It's because the Pope and the Church represent Jesus Christ who is Truth (Jn 14:6)! And every human being and every human heart is naturally attracted to the truth - there's no escaping it. So for me, the whole world's excitement and attention serves as confirmation that the Church you and I belong to, though imperfect, is the path to the truth. Now I don't know about you, but I've found it very nice to be reminded of this these past weeks.

Secondly, the election of Pope Leo XIV compels us to reflect on the importance of the office he now holds and remember that the papacy is not merely some human invention. Rather, it is deeply rooted in Sacred Scripture and was established by Christ Himself, when Saint Peter made his great confession of faith at Caesarea Philippi.

We hear about it in Matthew 16:13-19 when Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" and without hesitation Peter replied with conviction and clarity: *"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God"*...

And Jesus responded to him: *"You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church... I give to you the keys to the kingdom of heaven."*

It's at that point when Peter assumed his very special role among the Apostles as their leader and head, and from that moment on the entire New Testament points to the primacy of Saint Peter again and again.

For example, on Easter morning when John, the younger, faster and "beloved" disciple, runs with Peter to the empty tomb, he arrives before Peter, but waits outside until Peter arrives, deferring to him and allowing him to enter first (Jn 20:1-7).

Then, in every list of the apostles, Peter's name is always mentioned first.

In the Acts of the Apostles (2:14-41), it is Peter who stands up on Pentecost and speaks for the whole Church, and Peter who makes the hard decisions that set the course

for the early Christian community (Acts 15:7ff).

Why? Because Peter was given the charism of understanding Christ in His fullness, and was the first to proclaim: "You are the Christ!"

The pope today continues that mission of Saint Peter: to recognize and proclaim Christ and who He is in a complex world; to clarify matters of faith and strengthen us like Peter did for the early Church; and to remind us that our hope is not in ourselves, but in the Risen Christ.

Long live Pope Leo XIV!



Seventh Grade Art History

Mr. Sczweck's 7th-grade Art History classes have been exploring the concepts of truth, beauty, and goodness in art from the Renaissance period. Their analysis includes Albrecht Dürer's "Knight, Death, and the Devil," Caravaggio's "Calling of St. Matthew," and Michelangelo's Creation panel from the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.

In Caravaggio's painting, the gesture of Jesus extending his hand toward Matthew mirrors the biblical narrative of creation, where God breathes life into Adam. This gesture parallels the idea that Jesus offers Matthew a new life and purpose and, by extension, to all of humanity.

May Crowning is a traditional Catholic devotion that honors the Virgin Mary during May, which is dedicated to her. 
