

From the Pastor

There is need of only one thing.

Our Lord consoles his friend Martha and us with these words in this weekend's Gospel. How often in your day-to-day routines do you find yourself feeling like Martha? Worries, anxieties, things to be accomplished, tasks that remain out of our reach; these intrusions on our peace cause even the most grounded person to become unsettled from time to time. Martha's example, however, is a good one to learn from. It is in those moments of worry that Jesus speaks to our hearts, reminding us of His presence. In Martha's case, she expresses her love for Jesus in her hospitality. But her desire to provide for Jesus' temporal needs blinds her to what Mary is fully taking in, the Incarnate Word of God. Mary sees the invisible reality of who Jesus truly is. Martha gets stuck on loving Jesus for how He appears before her. In both cases, Jesus is nonetheless present to their needs and to their concerns! In the course of this coming week I encourage you to take a moment, slow down, and be reminded of Christ's presence in your life. Take a moment to pray, but be sure to listen to the *one thing* we truly *need*.

A great way to place your worries on Christ the Lord is through the intercession of Saint Anne. Our annual Parish Saint Anne Novena began this past Friday, July 18 and runs through this coming Saturday, July 26. A full schedule of events can be found on the seventh page of this bulletin.

Additionally, I wish to extend my deepest gratitude to everyone who made last Saturday's Installation Mass a beautiful celebration for the whole Parish. I was greatly moved by the presence of the number of people who attended. Thank you to everyone who made the day possible! I look forward serving the Lord with you as we seek to keep "the Passion of Christ always alive in our hearts."



Saint Paul of the Cross Parish is pleased to welcome Fr. Aron Maghsoudi as this year's guest preacher for the annual Saint Anne Novena (July 18th - 26th). Fr. Maghsoudi is a priest of the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown and serves as Pastor in Holy Family Parish (Hooversville, PA), Our Lady Queen of Angels Parish (Central City, PA), and All Saints Parish, (Boswell, PA). Additionally he serves as Chaplain for two state correctional institutions. A son of Latrobe and alumnus of Saint Vincent Seminary, Fr. Maghsoudi has served as a priest for almost 20 years. He brings with him a profound respect for the wealth of our Catholic traditions, ethnic heritage, and love of the saints. Please join us and Fr. Maghsoudi for this time of prayer, devotion, and celebrating the joy of our Catholic faith.

Reconciliation

During the Novena, there are many opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A sincere Confession unites us with Jesus. This act of leaving sin behind is not easy sometimes. Remorse may bring us to tears of regret when we realize the

impact of our hard-hearted actions. Mercifully, forgiveness is assured. Reconciliation is achieved because the Father still welcomes home prodigal sons and daughters. If you haven't been to Confession for a while, consider taking advantage of the many opportunities to go during this Novena week. If you're uncertain about how to properly celebrate the Sacrament, simply inform the priest that you would appreciate some guidance, and he will assist you in making a meaningful confession.

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, one should prepare with an Examination of Conscience, which involves reflecting prayerfully on one's thoughts, words, and deeds in order to identify any sins. There are various ways to examine your conscience but the one you use should be rooted in Scripture; particularly, the Ten Commandments and Beatitudes, like the ones printed below.

For Adults

I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me. Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother. Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill. Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind? Have I participated in an abortion, or encouraged someone to do so?

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and myself, and been faithful in marriage?

You shall not steal. Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse. Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods. Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?



For Children

Have I prayed my morning prayers and night prayers?

Have I prayed with my parents and family?

Have I been moody and rebellious about praying and going to church on Sunday?

Have I asked the Holy Spirit to help me whenever I have been tempted to sin?


