From the Pastor

Update on Saint Winfred Campus and Church

As you may recall from previous bulletin announcements and meetings, a couple years ago Bishop Zubik gave permission to the founders of South Hills Catholic Academy (SHCA) to open an independent Catholic school in the South Hills, and they chose to house the new school on the Saint Winifred campus. The parish entered into a lease agreement with the Academy on July 1, 2021, and the Academy opened its doors to students on September 1, 2021. The Academy has also purchased the former Saint Anne School building on Willow Avenue.

 The Academy has met with great success and currently has 385 students enrolled. On a daily basis they use the school, church and former convent buildings on the Saint Winifred campus.

Since July 2021 SHCA has paid for every expense at the Saint Winifred campus (e.g., utilities, insurance, landscaping, snow removal, etc.) and has also made many substantial improvements to the buildings and property. Without the Academy's financial backing of the Saint Winfred campus, there's no way the parish would be able to afford to properly maintain it. We simply do not have adequate income to sustain two campuses for our parish.

- We are now at the point where SHCA is prepared to purchase the Saint Winfred campus from the parish. To that end, in the name of our parish, I have requested permission to begin the final process of petitioning Bishop Zubik to relegate Saint Winifred Church to "profane but not sordid use". If the petition is granted, it means that the church would no longer be a church of Saint Paul of the Cross Parish.
- If Bishop Zubik accepts the petition to close Saint
 Winifred church, I would then immediately request
 him to establish it as a chapel for the school. The
 chapel would be owned by the school and would
 give the school children a place to pray and
 celebrate Mass.
- If permission is granted to officially close Saint Winifred church it will also lead to the sale of the entire Saint Winifred campus to SHCA.

 It is important to note that should a sale be completed, the parish will retain the right to conduct one Sunday Mass and occasional funerals in the chapel. All other sacraments (baptisms, weddings, confessions) will be celebrated in Saint Anne church.

Further, should the parish choose to, we will retain the right to use the Saint Winifred campus to house our food pantry and Faith Formation Program (CCD classes) and use the rectory as a residence for parish priests.

Partnering with South Hills Catholic Academy over the past two years has brought great benefits to both the parish and school. The Academy benefits from the various pastoral services we provide to them, such as weekday Masses, Confessions, Eucharistic Adoration, etc.



For the parish, the Academy has driven an uptick in registrations, bolstered activity in the community and, perhaps most importantly, provided a means by which the Saint Winifred campus will remain aligned with the parish's mission for generations to come, and remain a vibrant Catholic institution. To put it simply, without the Academy, the parish's financial condition would necessitate selling the Saint Winifred campus to some other party, most likely a developer.

May Crowning: May 2nd

May Crowning is a traditional Roman Catholic ritual held during the month of May. At the close of a solemn procession, a statue of the Blessed Virgin is crowned with a garland or crown of flowers honoring Mary as "The Queen of May." The queen symbol is attributed to Mary because she was a perfect follower of Christ. She is the Mother of the Son of God, who is the Messianic



King. The May Crowning gives the faithful, and in a special way, children, an opportunity to honor the Blessed Mother of Jesus and to give thanks to her for bringing our Savior into the world. Students of South Hills Catholic Academy will honor Mary with a May Crowning service in Saint Winifred church at 1:00 PM on Tuesday, May 2. All are welcome to attend.

Easter's Wake Up Call

It is common to splash water on our faces when we rise in the morning. The cool, wet shock on a sleepy face can get us going, awakening our senses and wash the sleep from our eyes. Startled from our half-sleep, we find ourselves more ready to face the day's tasks.

On Eater Sunday morning we experience a more joyful and solemn version of our daily morning splash, to remind us of the new life we celebrate. We gather together as the Church, perhaps still a bit tired from Lent's fasting, even a bit sleepy from Easter Vigil of the previous night. But just as the newly baptized are awakened from sin's sleep in flowing waters, we are doused with the same water that first roused us to life in Christ. By the sprinkling we are reminded of, and even startled by, who we are in Christ: God's adopted daughters and sons. Only then are we awake and ready to face the great task of baptized people: to gather around Christ's table and to give thanks and praise over gifts of bread and wine, to eat and drink of Christ's body and blood, and to go forth in service to the world.

Of course, it isn't enough to be "reawakened" on Easter Sunday alone. Indeed, every Sunday of Easter is a time to be sprinkled with the living waters, to be awakened once more to our Christian duty. And so we often begin our Sunday gatherings with the blessing and sprinkling of holy water, so that, as the Easter blessing of water says, it may "remind us of our baptism, and let us share the joy of all who have been baptized."



An aspergillum (or aspergil) is a liturgical implement used to sprinkle Holy Water. It comes in three forms: a freshly cut hyssop branch, a brushlike bundle that is dipped in the holy water and shaken, and a perforated, metal ball with a handle. Some have sponges or internal reservoirs that dispense holy water when shaken, while others must periodically be dipped in an aspersorium (holy water bucket or situla).




