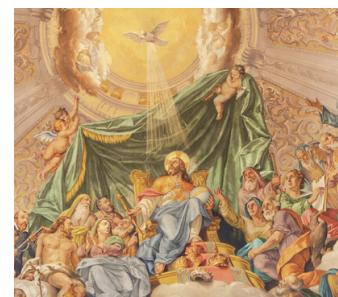

*He spoke to them only in parables,

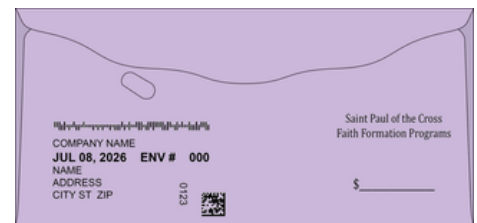

- The new guidelines will be effective **Monday, October 5, 2026**
 - The complete guidelines and suggested donation amounts for memorials will be published in the bulletin and on the parish website the beginning of **September 2026**.
- **NEW:** Sanctuary Lamp and Flower Memorials
 - Weekly memorials will be taken for the two (2) Sanctuary Lamps (the red candles nearest to the tabernacle) **AND** flower arrangements on the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph altars in St. Anne Church.
 - These memorials will be offered for one week (Saturday to Saturday).
- Please note: Mass Intention and Memorial Requests will be taken on a first come, first serve basis starting **NO EARLIER than 9:00 a.m., Monday, October 5, 2026**.

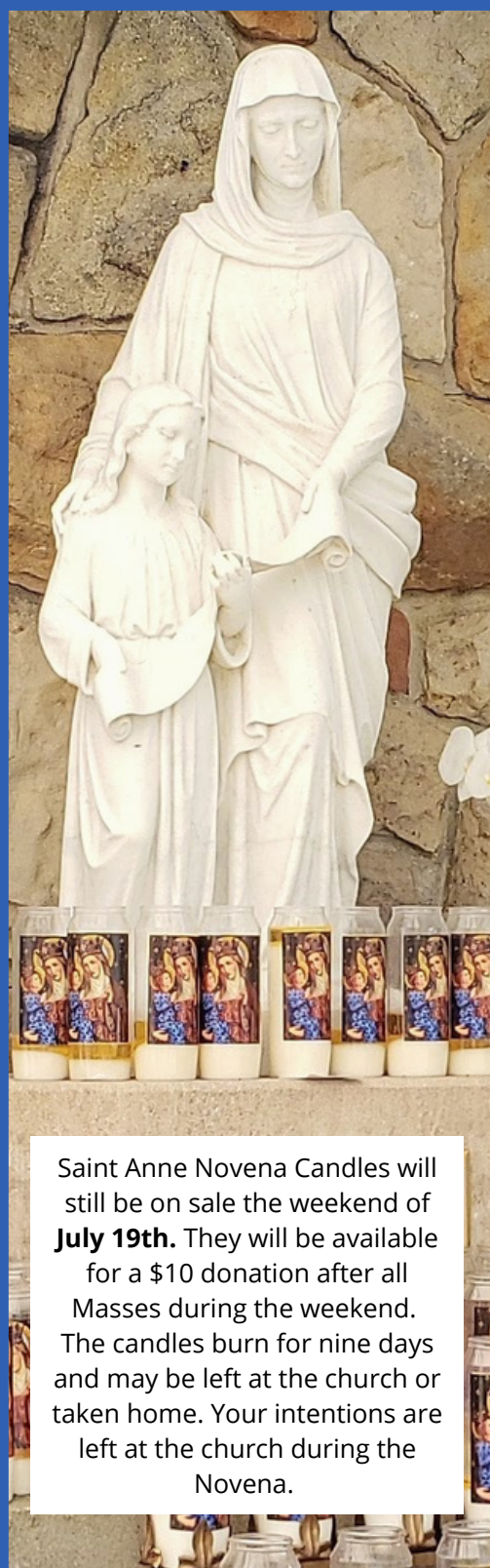

Saint Anne Novena Candles will still be on sale the weekend of **July 19th**. They will be available for a \$10 donation after all Masses during the weekend. The candles burn for nine days and may be left at the church or taken home. Your intentions are left at the church during the Novena.

Please join us this week for our St. Anne Novena at St. Anne Church, from **Saturday, July 18th through Sunday, July 26th**. Each day, Mass and Novena prayers will be offered, with special times set aside for Eucharistic Adoration, Confessions, veneration of the St. Anne relic, and Anointing of the Sick.

The Novena features guest speakers Fr. Joachim Morgan, OSB, and Fr. Barnabas O'Reilly, OSB, who will give a multi-part talk on finding faith when it doesn't make sense, discovering hope in times of despair, and learning to love through the perfection of sacrifice, all viewed through the beautiful life of St. Anne and her family. They will speak at every Mass during the Novena, sharing a new segment of the talk each day.

Opportunities For Reconciliation

During the Novena, there are many opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A sincere Confession unites us with Jesus. This act of leaving sin behind is not easy sometimes. Remorse may bring us to tears of regret when we realize the impact of our hard-hearted actions. Mercifully, forgiveness is assured. Reconciliation is achieved because the Father still welcomes home prodigal sons and daughters. If you haven't been to Confession for a while, consider taking advantage of the many opportunities to go during this Novena week. If you're uncertain about how to properly celebrate the Sacrament, simply inform the priest that you would appreciate some guidance, and he will assist you in making a meaningful confession.

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation, one should prepare with an Examination of Conscience, which involves reflecting prayerfully on one's thoughts, words, and deeds in order to identify any sins. There are various ways to examine your conscience but the one you use should be rooted in Scripture; particularly, the Ten Commandments and Beatitudes, like the ones printed below.

For Adults

I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me. Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother. Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill. Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind? Have I participated in an abortion, or encouraged someone to do so?

You shall not commit adultery. Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and myself, and been faithful in marriage?

You shall not steal. Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse. Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods. Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?



For Children

Responsibilities to God:

- Have I prayed every day?
- Have I prayed my morning prayers and night prayers?
- Have I prayed with my parents and family?
- Have I been moody and rebellious about praying and going to church on Sunday?
- Have I asked the Holy Spirit to help me whenever I have been tempted to sin?
- Have I asked the Holy Spirit to help me do what is right?

Responsibilities to others:

- Have I been obedient and respectful to my parents?
- Have I lied or been deceitful to them or to others?
- Have I been arrogant, stubborn or rebellious?
- Have I talked back to parents, teachers or other adults?
- Have I pouted and been moody?
- Have I been selfish toward my parents, brothers, and sisters, teachers, or my friends and schoolmates?
- Have I gotten angry at them? Have I hit anyone?
- Have I held grudges or not forgiven others?
- Have I treated other children with respect or have I made fun of them and called them names?
- Have I used bad language?
- Have I stolen anything? Have I returned it?
- Have I performed my responsibilities, such as homework and household chores?
- Have I been helpful and affectionate toward my family?
- Have I been kind and generous with my friends?
- Have I cheated in school?

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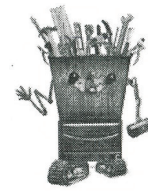
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
