CORPUS CHRISTI

FROM THE PASTOR

O Sacrament Most Holy

Today is the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (the Body and Blood of Christ). On this Feast Day the Church wishes to hold up for our contemplation and devotion the central mystery of our Catholic faith: the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, sacrificed daily on our altar and perpetually present in the tabernacle.

As He was ascending to the glory of the Father, Jesus said, "Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28.20). And He also taught us: "Amen, amen, I say to you: unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6.53). Jesus fulfills both of these promises by remaining with His Church and giving Himself to us in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.



Today's Feast Day affords us the opportunity to renew our devotion to the Real Presence by receiving Holy Communion with greater reverence, committing to attend Eucharistic Adoration with greater frequency and by concretely expressing in some appropriate manner our belief and trust that Jesus is with us in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

Parish Updates:

As we emerge from the pandemic and things increasingly return to normal, I wanted to provide an update on various matters pertaining to parish life:

1) Pastoral Council:

On May 26th the Pastoral Council met in person for the first time since the pandemic. Three new members were welcomed: Lynne Aber, Katie Boss and Karen O'Keefe. The Council then reviewed the basics tenets of the Pastoral Plan that was adopted last year and reorganized the committees to address its areas of focus, namely, Adult Faith Formation, Evangelization and Outreach, and Facilities. Members of the Council will also participate in an upcoming communications survey to be conducted by the Ed Macko Design Group. Finally, the Council endorsed the planning of a Ministry Fair to be held on the grounds of the Saint Anne campus on Sunday, September 26th.

2) Building Committee:

As was mentioned earlier, the parish has retained the DLA Architectural Firm to develop a master plan for the parish's future facilities footprint, now that we've made the decision to consolidate all parish activities on the Saint Anne campus. Last week the Parish Building Committee (comprised of representatives from the Parish Staff and Pastoral and Finance councils) met with DLA who presented some schemas for our consideration. Based on the Committee's input, the architects will undertake some revisions to their proposal before presenting us with the final Master Plan over the next month or so.

3) South Hills Catholic Academy/Saint Winifred School Building:

On Friday, May 28th, the Mount Lebanon Montessori School moved out of the Saint Winifred School building to its new location. We wish them all the best and are grateful for the many years they were able to operate in the school. As has been widely publicized, the newly established South Hills Catholic Academy will be opening this fall in the school building, and beginning last Tuesday they have begun renovations. Please be aware that work in the school building will continue through mid-August.

4) Organ Renovation:

Throughout the summer months significant work will continue on the Saint Anne church organ, leading to some scaffolding being erected in the sanctuary. Apologies for any inconveniences or disruptions that may occur from time to time.

5) Parish Fair and Vacation Bible School:

Due to continuing uncertainties related to the pandemic, and to the fact that the supplier for the rides and many of our booths for the Fair decided not to operate this summer, the decision was made to cancel this summer's Parish Fair.

Also, because of the aforementioned renovations taking place in the Saint Winifred School building and with the organ in Saint Anne church, we will unfortunately be unable to present Vacation Bible School for the kids this summer. We simply do not have adequate space available to put on a quality program this year. We do plan to resume VBS next summer.

6) Parish Ministry Fair:

Although we are unable to hold our annual Fair this summer, members of the staff and Pastoral Council felt that we should attempt to hold some sort of event to bring people together. Therefore, a Parish Ministry Fair is being organized for Sunday, September 26th beginning at 11:00am on the grounds of Saint Anne church. This event will provide the many organizations and ministries of the parish the opportunity to highlight their good works and hopefully attract some new members. Food trucks will be on hand as well as fun activities for the kids. More information to follow.




WEEK IN REVIEW

MISSION CO-OP WEEKEND: JUNE 5 AND 6

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESE OF MASAKA

I am Fr. Peter Claver Mawanda from the Diocese of Masaka, Uganda, and currently a student at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh. Before coming to Pittsburgh, I worked as a teacher and Director of Studies at Masaka Diocesan Holy Family Seminary. This high school/ college seminary has an average total population of about 500 seminarians who train there for six years before joining the major seminary and eventually becoming priests.

Since its founding in 1893, Holy Family Seminary has trained and produced six bishops (including the current Ordinary of Masaka, Bishop Severus Jjumba), three cardinals, and many priests (including myself).

During my four-year assignment at Holy Family Seminary, however, I noted many challenges that interfered with and crippled the Seminary's mission of forming future priests for the Church. But three critically stood out: (i) food insecurity, (ii) unreliable electricity, and (iii) inadequate water. And it is these three that I would like to bring before you, kindly asking for your support.

Although the seminary has enough land, it doesn't have the needed agricultural equipment to work that land to ensure food security. Purchasing food to feed seminarians remains one of the biggest challenges that constantly drains the meagre resources of the seminary. Procuring a farm tractor and attached equipment to work the land would guarantee food security for the seminary. But the seminary cannot afford this.

Secondly, although the seminary is connected to the national power grid, the electricity supply is not reliable. There are lots of power outages due to recurrent load shedding. Load shedding is when power companies reduce electricity consumption by switching off the power supply to groups of customers because the entire system is at risk of overload. This continually interrupts and destabilizes the smooth flow of activities at the seminary. Students and teachers are constantly forced to resort to rudimentary sources of lighting and energy, particularly at night. With your help, purchase and installation of solar power to supplement this unreliable electricity will greatly save the situation. Fortunately, the seminary is very near the equator and the sun never fails.

Lastly, there is great need to upgrade the seminary's old, small, and often failing piped water system, backing it up with a rainwater collection system as well. Twice a year, Masaka region experiences two dry seasons, often turning into drought. A functional water supply system and adequate water storage facilities are key to ensuring the health of the seminary.

Sisters and Brothers, the seminary finds itself in extraordinarily very trying financial times. While it struggles really hard to subsidize seminary education and formation, the pressing challenges I have brought before you today can hardly be addressed without assistance from people of good will. All of us have been variously hit and adversely impacted by the pandemic! Still, I strongly trust and humbly pray that, for the greater glory of God, your generosity will not only prevail but even increase at such times of extraordinary challenges as these. Thank you!






