### Assurance of Salvation I

## ***Invention Convention***

On Tuesday, April 30, 2019, Saint Anne School students in grades 2-8 participated in the inaugural Invention Convention held at Seton LaSalle Catholic High School. Over 250 students from six area elementary schools participated! This science event encouraged students to apply basic science skills in a creative and productive manner. Participants were required to identify a need or solve a problem by following the same steps an inventor would follow. Once a need or a problem was identified, students were directed to use problem-solving and creative-thinking skills to invent a product or process that would fill the need or overcome the problem. A panel of judges visited each student to ask questions and assess each project using several different parameters including presentation skills and project appearance. Several Saint Anne School students received individual awards; and Saint Anne School received the *Most School Spirit Award* and the *First Place Overall Award*. Congratulations to our students and to their hard-working and dedicated teachers!

## ***Very Important Principal Award***

The principal of Saint Anne School thought she was being called to the school gymnasium by her staff to assist with the upcoming talent show. Instead, the Saint Anne School students, faculty, and staff were on hand to see Ms. Kathleen Carnicella, Director of the Non-Public Schools Program for the Allegheny Intermediate Unit (AIU), present Mrs. Stewart with the 2018-2019 Very Important Principal Award.

Representatives from the AIU, and the Pastor of Saint Anne Parish and School, Fr. Michael Caridi, were also on hand for the celebration.

Mrs. Trish Trappen and Mrs. Amy Renegar, the AIU representatives assigned to Saint Anne School, nominated Mrs. Stewart for the award. The nomination was based on Mrs. Stewart's professionalism, dedication, leadership with her staff, students, and parents, and her cooperation with and support of the AIU staff.
