FROM THE PASTOR

Saint Paul of the Cross Parish

As anticipated, on Friday, May 17th, Bishop Zubik signed a decree merging Saint Anne and Saint Winifred parishes into the new Saint Paul of the Cross Parish, effective Monday, July 1st. You can read the decree on our parish website, and a letter from the Bishop is published in today's bulletin.

The formation of the new parish is the culmination of the Bishop's "On Mission" initiative meant to address changing demographics in the Church, the decline in priestly vocations, and marshal resources to better serve the people.

It is important to note that while our parish will have a new name – Saint Paul of the Cross – each church will retain the name under which it was consecrated. Therefore, Saint Paul of the Cross will be one parish with two churches, Saint Anne and Saint Winifred! Saint Anne School will also retain its name.

Why "Saint Paul of the Cross"?

Saint Paul of the Cross (1694-1775), born Paul Danei in northern Italy, experienced a conversion to a life of prayer at age 19. Influenced by the writings of Saint Francis de Sales, it became Paul's lifelong conviction that God is most easily encountered and understood in the Passion of Jesus Christ.

When Paul was 26, he had an experience making it clear to him that God was inviting him to form a religious order that would promote the love of God revealed in the Passion of Christ. At age 33 he was ordained a Catholic priest and in due time established the community that came to be known as the Congregation of the Passion, or the Passionists.

The first Passionists to arrive in America were brought to Pittsburgh by Bishop Michael O'Connor in 1852. They originally staffed Saint Michael Parish on the Southside and built Saint Paul of the Cross Monastery and Retreat Center where many of our parishioners make their annual retreat, even today!

In 1892 the Passionists were invited by the Opferman family to celebrate monthly Mass in their home in what is now Bethel Park, and four years later, as a result of their pastoral care, it was the Passionists who established the first Catholic parish in the South Hills, Saint Anne's.

As the population continued to grow, several other parishes were formed out of Saint Anne's, including Saint Winifred's in 1960.

Therefore, the Bishop's naming Saint Paul of the Cross as our patron is a tribute to the firm foundation of faith the Passionists established in our community.

What will happen leading up to July 1st and the establishment of Saint Paul of the Cross Parish?

Please pray for the parish staff, that the decisions and actions we make over the next few weeks will be prudent so as to set the new parish off in as good a direction as possible.

Will the Mass Schedule remain the same?

For the summer months the Mass schedule will remain the same. However, once Fall arrives there will be some modifications due to Sunday CCD times and recent attendance trends.

In closing, while we have been anticipating the merger of Saint Anne and Saint Winifred parishes for quite some time, the fact that it will soon become a reality evokes a variety of mixed emotions.

It is my hope and prayer that we will embrace the positives: our new parish will be bigger, it will be able to finance more ministries and initiatives and we will have an additional patron saint, Paul of the Cross, whose example reminds us of what is most important; namely, that consumed by love for us, Jesus Christ suffered and died so that we can gain paradise.

Essentially, the mission of our new parish will be to proclaim and make present this awesome and beautiful reality.

Our students took part in the Environmental Science on the Three Rivers (ES) program, which focuses on river ecosystems. As described on the RiverQuest website, our students were able to “become junior scientists for the day as they traveled the three rivers analyzing chemical and physical water quality indicators, studying macro and micro invertebrates, and identifying birds and native fish species. Remake Learning Days – Anaglyph Lesson

The definition of an anaglyph is “a stereoscopic photograph with the two images superimposed and printed in different colors, producing a stereo effect when the photograph is viewed through correspondingly colored filters.” During Remake Learning Days the first and second graders learned about anaglyphs, then viewed several different types using 3D glasses. First grade teacher Miss Oros, then taught the classes how to draw their own anaglyphs. The students were delighted and thrilled that their anaglyphs actually looked like 3D images when they used their glasses!

SOCIAL MINISTRY

CARE

CARE is a program created by committed Catholics in Pittsburgh working with Casa San Jose, the community center for Latinos in our area founded by the Sisters of St. Joseph and located in Beechview. CARE works to connect parish-based volunteers with Pittsburgh residents and their families who are legally in our country awaiting asylum. These families are in need of accompaniment and emotional, social service and spiritual support when integrating into their communities or attempting to comply with immigration proceedings. Miriam Manion is organizing CARE efforts at St. Anne. We are seeking volunteers to participate in CARE at St. Anne to support immigrants from Latin America. Casa San Jose will coordinate training and orientation for volunteers from St. Anne before they are assigned a family to help. Volunteers can provide little or a lot of time to helping families in need, depending on their availability. Our parish liaison will coordinate our own volunteers' time. Ideally, each volunteer would support one family but it is also possible that multiple volunteers would support one family based entirely on volunteer time and client family need.
