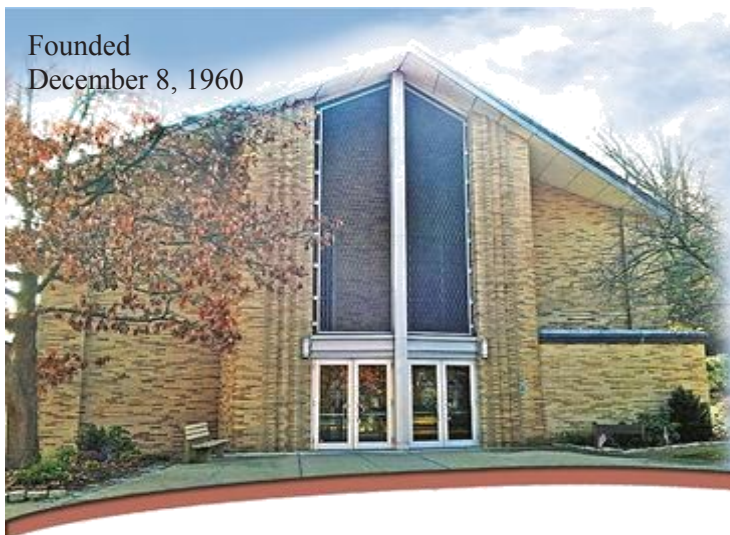

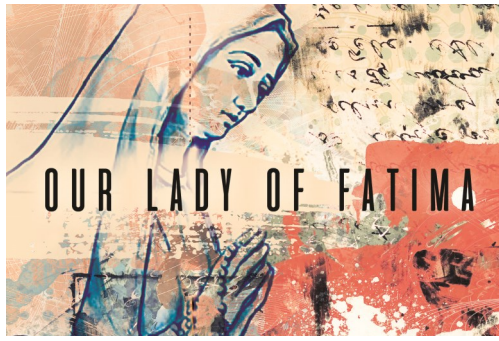

### FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MIKE . . .

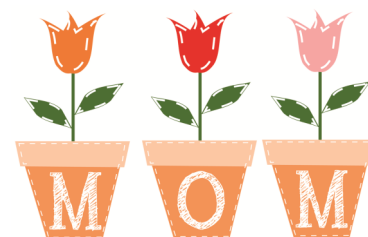
#### *Honoring our Blessed Mother and all Mothers . . .*

Recently my mother had me look up the song “Hail Mary, Gentle Woman” on You Tube. It’s one of her favorites and she enjoyed hearing and singing along with the video. I think that many folks enjoy *Gentle Woman*, not only because it’s an easy song to sing, but also because the words suggest the type of Christian model of holiness we like to praise: an individual who is gentle and radiant—a quiet, pure light, a peaceful dove who shares with us her love and wisdom.

And Mary, full of grace, teaches us in such a tender way how to carry her Son within us. That with God’s help, we have to strive to become like her: sinless, pure, and full of grace, so that Jesus will find a worthy dwelling place within us as He did in her.

In the Catholic Church we set aside May as a special month to honor the Blessed Mother, for in her we find the greatest model of Christian faith and a loyal intercessor who always presents our needs, hopes and desires to her son, Jesus. Therefore, throughout this month we are called upon to publicly manifest our devotion to Mary. This can be accomplished in a variety of ways: by praying a family Rosary each day during the month, setting up a May altar in the home, lighting a votive candle before an image or statue of Mary, or simply reflecting upon the beautiful model of faith with which she provides us.

During this month devoted to Jesus’ mother, today we are called upon to honor our own mothers and express gratitude to them for all they’ve done for us. On a natural level, our mothers have given birth to us, nourished, sustained and educated us. More importantly, on a supernatural level, our mothers concretely manifest for us what Christ’s unconditional and sacrificial love is all about. And so, for revealing the inner heart of God, we thank our mothers and renew our devotion to them today.
